
EMBASSY CLUB


John Sweeney did the calling for Valley Squares, while Ray Neely called for the R & R Square Dance Club.



The Callerlab selection of Mainstream calls for the 4th quarters of 1976 are: Touch, Touch 1/4, 1/2, 3/4, plus the call of Roll. The brevity of both of these calls is quite unusual plus the fact that the movement, on the part of the dancers, that is generated by the calls are equally brief.

Touch: This call is intended for facing dancers and simply means for the dancers to step forward and touch right hands and create Ocean Waves. Naturally, the call of Left Touch means a left hand Ocean Wave. The fractional turns are optional. 1/4 means to turn 1/4 or a single hinge. 1/2 means a turn of 1/2 or a Trade. 3/4 means a 3/4 turn and is equal to a Cast 3/4. It has been noted that

Touch 1/4 is equal to a Curlique but it is not intended to replace the call of Curlique. Both calls will find their place in future choreography.

Roll: The call of Roll means that the moving dancers will add an individual turn of 1/4, in the direction of their body flow, from the previous call.

It is possible that both of the above calls will rapidly find their way into Club Level and Mainstream dancing. Dancers will quickly become familiar with both calls and the reaction will probably be favorable because of the brevity. Callers will find the calls usable and frequent use will bring about rapid acceptance as future basic calls.




