DISTRICT COMBINES BUSINESS WITH PLEASURE

Twenty two squares enjoyed 3 hours of dancing at Benner Hall in Richlandtown before settling down for a meeting of the Mid-East Penn District on Sunday, May 7. Highlights of the business session included discussions of increasing dues, sponsoring dances featuring national callers, and writing District by-laws.

In view of the considerable number of national callers currently scheduled for this area, the District decided not to sponsor such dances which might conflict with other club, district, or Federation affairs.

In a split decision, it was decided to increase dues for the coming year, to cover additional services such as the

EDUCATIONAL SEMINAR SET

That acronym stands for Dancers Involved in Exchanging Thoughts over a wide range of subjects basic to the health of square and round dancing.

As of June 9, 40 dedicated dancers have signed up for the two sessions of five simultaneous seminars, running from 2:00 to 6:15 p.m., with a refreshment break between sessions and a most important general summary session at the end.

**MANY ACTIVITIES DISCLOSED
AT FEDERATION MEETING**

Fifty-five persons attended the May 11 meeting of the Federation of Delaware Valley Square and Round Dancers, held at the Philadelphia Sheraton Hotel. A wide variety of subjects came up for discussion, and many interesting reports were submitted.

Financially, the Federation is in an excellent position, with approximately \$3200 in the bank and a large amount to be received as surplus funds from the 26th National.

Membership, too, is a very encouraging statistic, with Bucks-Trenton reporting 717 members, Mid-East Penn 933, Pen Del 1366, and Penn Jersey 1250, for a grand total of 4266 and growing by leaps and bounds with the new class graduates.

Education has several major projects nearing completion. The quilt for the Showcase of Ideas will go to Oklahoma City with over a hundred club patches assembled within a handsome border, but the quilting stitching will have to be added upon its return. It is expected that it will be completed in time for the Delaware Valley Convention. Eventual disposition of this beautiful quilt is a question yet to be resolved.

The DIET '78 educational seminar is scheduled for July 16, 2 to 6:15 p.m., at Sun Center in Feltonville, with John Kaltenthaler of CALLERLAB and LEGACY as keynote speaker. Details of the sessions available are given on page 2.

The Federation's Historian has offered a suggestion that a Square Dance Museum be established, with displays depicting each district's history and activities, manikins dressed in square dance clothes of different eras, and files and storage for Federation records and archives.

The museum was included in a list of items proposed to receive funding from the 26th National surplus. Other ideas were submitted by a committee formed for the purpose, and the total list was forwarded for consideration.



26th NATIONAL ALLOTS SURPLUS CONVENTION FUNDS

At a special meeting of the Executive Board of the 26th National Square Dance Convention, held on May 20 at the City Line Marriott, disbursement of surplus funds was the main consideration. The report published last fall demonstrated the immensity of the undertaking, with total receipts of \$267,920.49 and disbursements of \$217,450.83, resulting in a balance on hand of \$50,469.66. Add to this a contribution from the Atlantic City Convention Bureau estimated to be \$20,000 and the total surplus was over \$70,000.

Early this year all Gold Star Boosters and clubs were reimbursed for their contributions, and donations were made to various square dance and caller organizations, leaving a balance of \$38,700 to be distributed as the final official act of the Executive Board.

Suggestions from the Federation and from the floor were considered, as well as the contractual agreement with the Federation that 10% of any surplus be held for a possible future National in the Delaware Valley. It was decided that a certificate of deposit for \$7,500 will be purchased in the name of the Federation, this money and accrued interest to be used solely as "seed money"

for any future National Convention in this area. It was also voted to permit our neighboring square dance associations to borrow from the \$7,500 as seed money for any National they might sponsor, to be repaid from their first registration receipts.

The remaining surplus will be turned over to the Delaware Valley Federation with the proviso that \$5,000 be an outright grant for any Federation purpose and the balance of the money be invested. The interest on this fund is to be used for the purpose of providing scholarships for callers, and to provide summer dances for new dancers in each district.

Of the balance invested, up to \$5000 may be used by the Federation for the purpose of establishing a Square Dance Museum and Archives Center if acted upon within two years.

On the advice of the attorney, funds may be withdrawn from the separate savings account only following approval, in writing, of the Board of Trustees of the 26th National, Steve & Dorothy Musial, Joe & Rita Botta, and Frank & Connie Evans, with the recommended addition of three couples from the current officers of the Federation.

In order to maintain the recommended control through the Board of Trustees, it was decided not to dissolve the 26th National Corporation at this time.




to the pleasure of the festivities.
