CRISIS

For the past four years your district chairmen have tried to explain the need for an increase in the membership dues. Since an adequate balance in our savings existed many could not see a need to increase the dues a small amount each year even though the forecast looked dim. Accordingly increased inflation and service to our members has taken its toll. **WE ARE OUT OF MONEY!** This may be the last issue of Squares and Rounds, unless our emergency funding, each club selling 50-50 tickets, bears fruit.

The future looks equally as dim at this time. Following, you will find an explanation of where the money has gone and where we anticipate using it, if we can. The need to double the dues is very real and necessary if we expect to receive the same benefits we've been getting in the past.

At this point your executive committee is looking for guidance, we don't know where to turn. Some suggest having dances to supplement our treasury, at \$150-\$200 for a hall and \$150-\$200 for callers, a dance would need 25-30 squares to break even. How many of these would you support? The most we can turn out for a "free" dance is 20-25 squares.

The federation is currently looking into the aspects of publishing a monthly magazine covering the entire federation, but the results could be several years distant. We need immediate help for our problem! Do you have a worthwhile suggestion? Please write to the Chairmen or the Vice Chairmen and let us know your feelings. Do you want the Squares and Rounds to continue? Is it worth paying for? Are the services WE do worthwhile or should we stop them? You are the District and Federation, your comments are very important to us.

Please write and tell us how you wish us to proceed with your district. This year we have the largest membership ever in our district, 1046 members. And we hope to continue to grow. The executive committee continually strives to improve the benefits for your enrichment, consequently, some of these, such as improved communications cost money. To eliminate any of the services we offer you would be taking steps backward instead of forward.

A token of appreciation was given to Jane Arnst for her assistance as our "Banker" throughout the year.

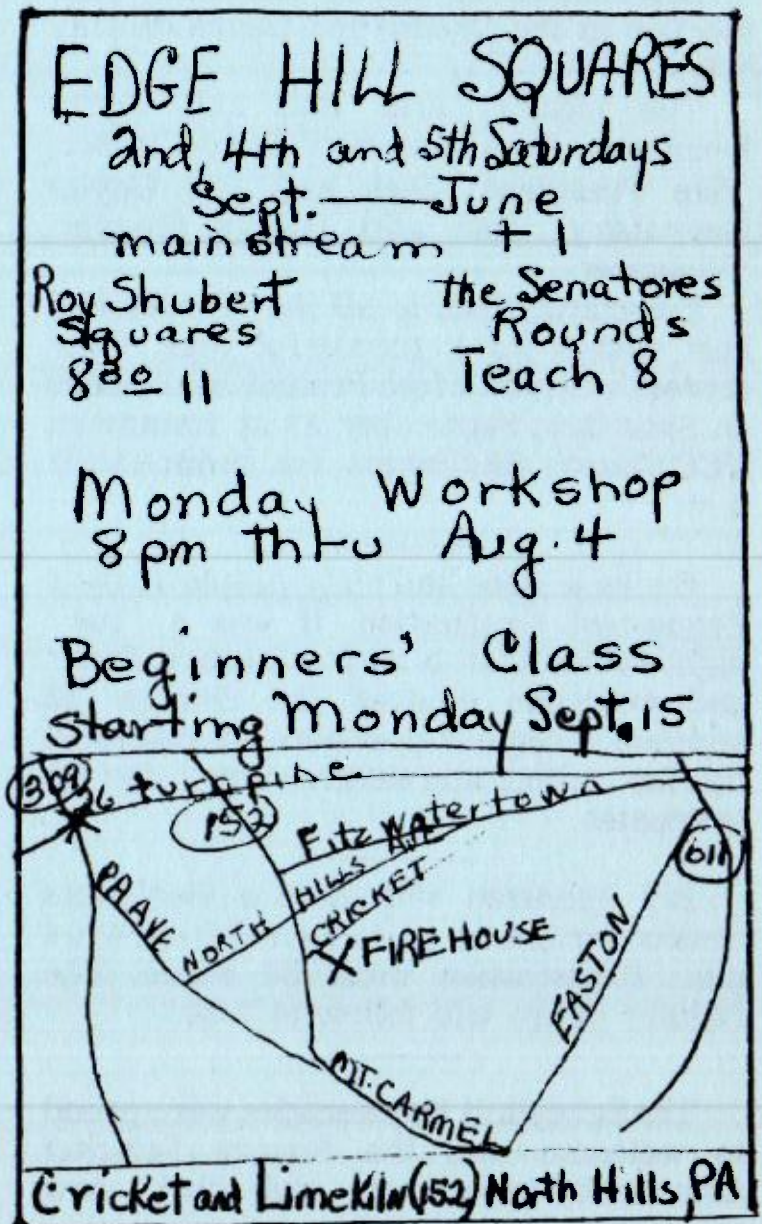

SO YOU WANT TO BE A CALLER

By John J. Sweeney

For those of you who have considered being callers, a few good tips on how and where to begin will be very helpful.

First and foremost, be a good dancer. This not only includes being able to perform each figure from a variety of danceable positions, but being able to dance smoothly, with grace and style. Once you pick up the microphone, you will abruptly change from a follower to a leader. The other dancers will now be looking at you and your dance style. If you do not look like a good dancer, their confidence in and opinion of you as a caller will suffer.

Read. There is now a multitude of information published on how to be a caller. Although you will never be able to read one of these books and then step up to the mike and start calling perfectly, it will enable you to be aware of certain things before you start calling. These include timing, melody, pitch, flow, choreography construction, singing call presentation, sight calling, module calling, and stage presence, to name a few.

One way to learn a lot quickly is to attend a Caller's College. These are one week seminars which not only deal with the technical aspects of calling but also the non-technical side which is just as important. These topics include leadership, caller's responsibility, responsibility of the caller's partner,

philosophy, caller-partner relationships (it will change when one decides to be a caller), and caller ethics, to name a few.

The technical aspects will be appraised and criticized. If you are going to call you'd better decide right now to accept criticism, no matter how good you get. Only through criticism will you know what needs improvement, and everyone can always improve no matter how good they are.

Find a good, experienced caller who is willing to work with you. Someone who can give you pointers and guide you along. This person may not be able to dedicate a lot of time to teaching you but he should be able to make suggestions and answer your questions. He should also be willing to give you the microphone and let you call a tip now and then.

If you are going to be a reasonably good caller, you will have to practice and practice and practice. As you will learn, calling is hard work, it is not easy. From the day you begin calling you will work at it until the day you retire. You will always have to present new choreography and singing calls. The only way you will ever learn is to practice.

And in the end it is the dancers who will tell you if you are doing right or wrong . . . by their applause.

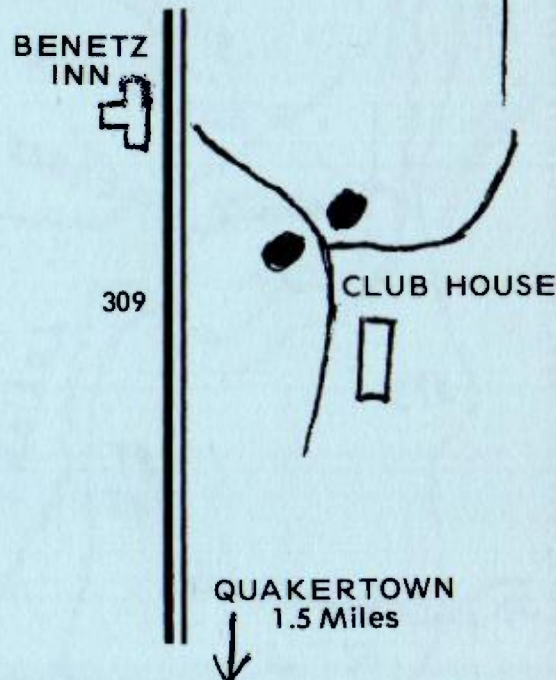

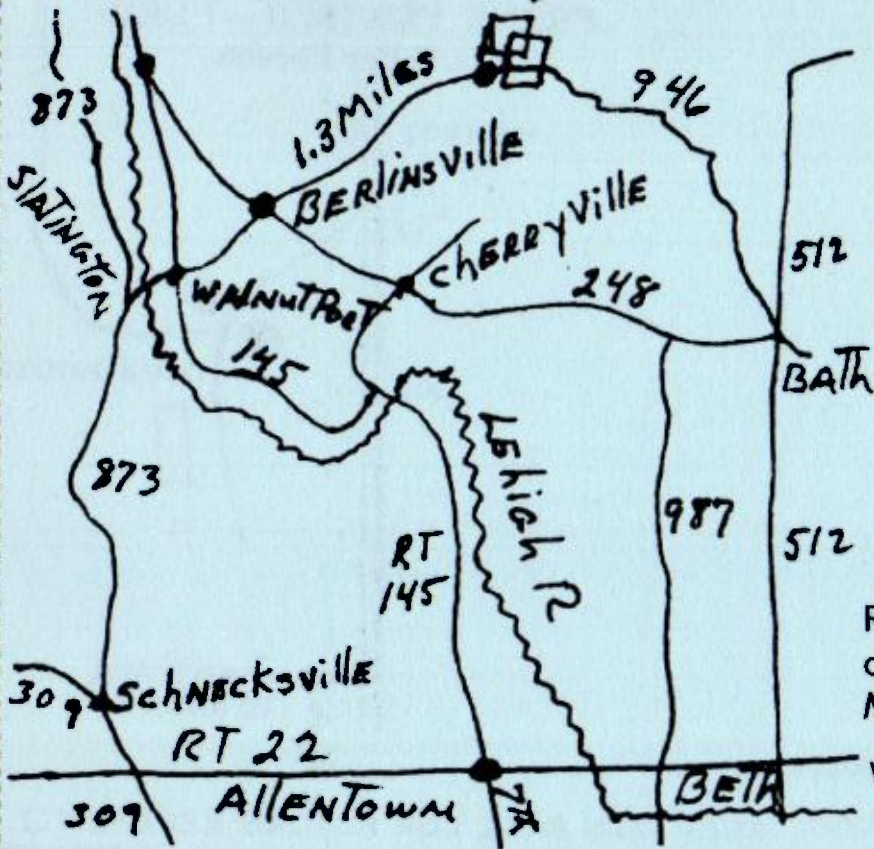
