D.V.S. & R.D. FEDERATION MEETING UPDATE

Another excellent turnout for our FEDERATION MEETING held on November 13, 1986, at the Dunfey City Line Hotel in Philadelphia -- approximately 70 people were in attendance.

At 8:05 PM, Bill Manuel, President, brought the meeting to order and completed a very full agenda by 10:05 PM -- not an easy feat, at best. The items under discussion were:

- Joe & Betty Mathers were introduced as the Chairmen for the 27th D.V.S. & R.D. Convention.

- It was decided that the Federation would begin replacing some of the sound equipment that is outdated.

- Juanita Dye presented to Presidents Bill & Doris Manuel a check in the amount of \$8,477.00 as proceeds from the 25th D.V.S. & R.D. Convention.

- Each District Chairman was asked to give the Federation Secretary a list of all their club presidents, their addresses and telephone numbers.

- District Chairmen were asked to instruct their membership chairmen to follow the instruction sheet that was distributed with the 1987 membership cards, rosters and stickers.

- President Bill Manuel reported that he had mailed questionnaires to 130 clubs asking for their support for a 1992 National Convention to be held in Philadelphia. Bill reported that he received a 53% return (or 69 questionnaires) with only 4 clubs who did not wish to participate. Permission was given to Bill Manuel to appoint 4 couples to select a possible chairperson for the 1992 National Convention.

- John Schapperle announced the slate of officers for the 1987-88 Federation Board of Directors. They are: Doug & Ethel Vollmer (President), John & Mary Ellen Lachenmayer (Vice President), Jack & Barbara Kahler (Treasurer) and Meryl Plummer (Secretary).

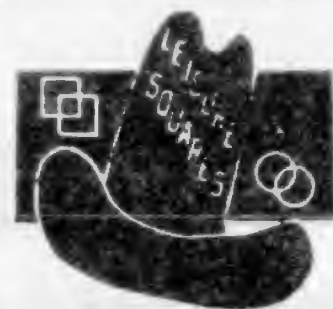

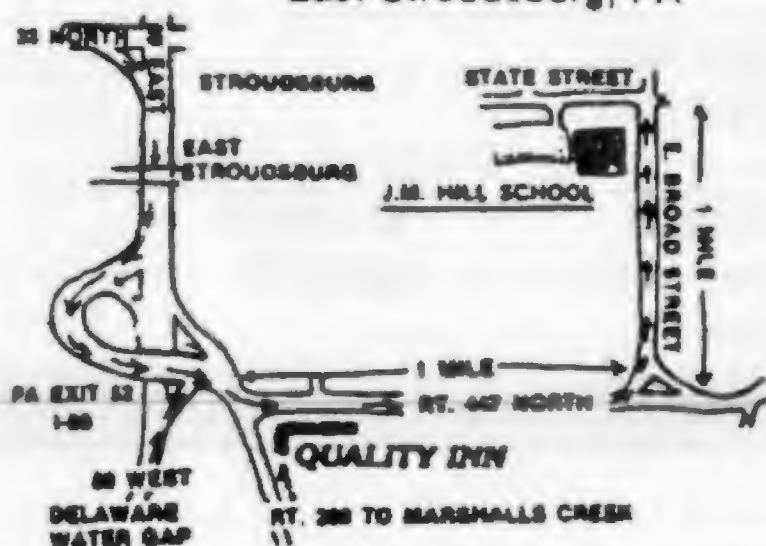

NASA TRIP A MUST FOR SIGHTSEERS

If you have an interest in space technology and exploration, then while your in Houston at the 36th National Square Dance Convention, a visit to the Lyndon B. Johnson Space Center is a must, there is nothing like it in the world. The space complex, more commonly known as mission control, serves as the nerve center of our country's manned spaceflight program. Here the astronauts receive their training and undergo rigorous testing to determine their ability to withstand the environment of outer space. In addition, all manned space flights are detected and monitored from mission control.

The collection of equipment and hardware from America's space voyages is truly awe-inspiring. Among the exhibits are astronaut Gordon Cooper's Mercury space capsule, the Lunar exploration module, the Apollo 17 spacecraft, and a Saturn V rocket.

Your first stop at mission control should be the visitor orientation center, where

you can view official NASA films. The visitor center is also the starting point of tours. The tours include visits to the mission control center viewing room, space environment simulation laboratory, rocket park, mission simulation and training facilities, the moon rock collection and Building 2 where thousands of artifacts and space gear are on display.

Getting to the space center is easy. From the Astrodome, take 610 East to the I-45/Galveston exit. Follow I-45 toward Galveston and exit at NASA Road, then follow the signs to the NASA center. Allow at least 4 hours for travel time and tour. The center is open daily from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM. Admission is free, and don't forget your camera.

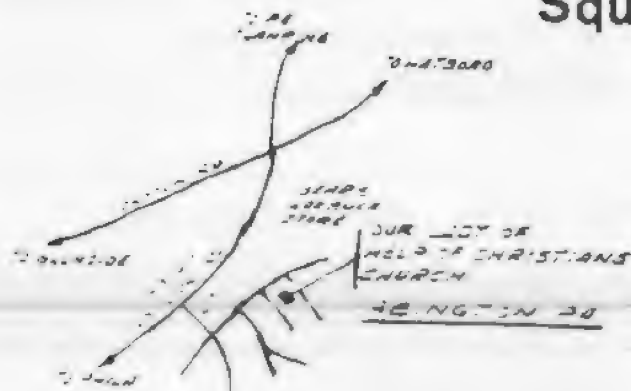

HOW TO IMPROVE "SQUARES AND ROUNDS"

Someone at our November District Membership Dance and I were talking about our District's magazine, "Squares and Rounds." We were comparing it with our neighboring district Pen-Del's, "Fed Fax."

Yes, "Fed-Fax" is a great little magazine. We still get it to keep up with what is going on in the Pen-Del District. What

makes it so great? I personally can answer this because I was once a member of the Pen-Del District and at one time was a club news person. It takes the hard work of the staff as well as each district and Federation member to contribute items, not just one person.

The person I was talking to said, "Why can't Ralph Trout write articles?" I replied with two reasons, "First, he does not have the time and second, he is not a member of the district and he doesn't know what is going on."

It is the responsibility of our members and staff to improve our magazine, not Ralph Trouts or outsiders who write about the Tournament of Roses, National Convention, etc. It is up to us to match "Fed-Fax" and no one else. Ralph Trout only prints what we give him or what he receives.

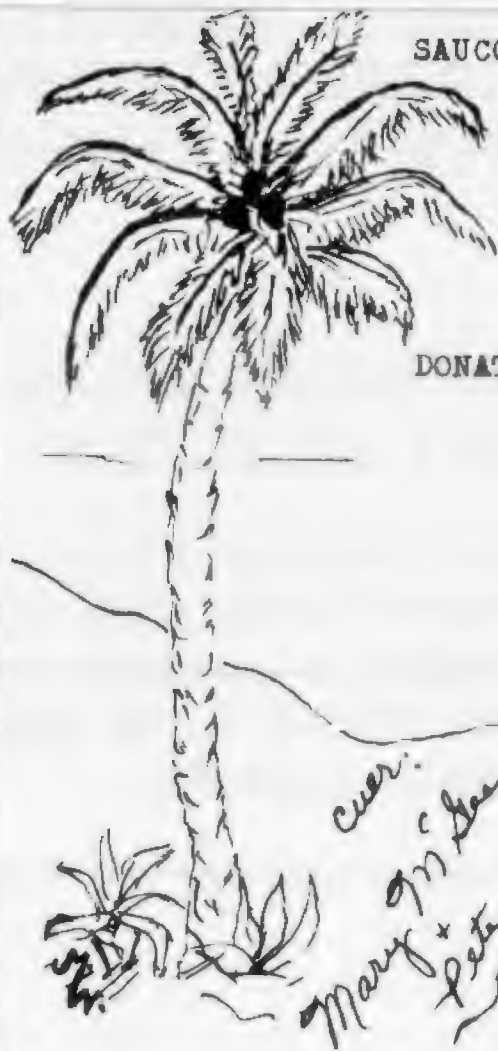

stream Quarterly Selection for the period beginning October 1, 1986.

SCOOT AND RELOCATE: Starts from a $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag. Center wave dancers step forward and Turn Thru with outside dancers, and then return to a wave in the center (Scoot Back). Center wave then does a Fan The Top while the outside dancers individually turn $\frac{1}{4}$ right and single file Promenade $\frac{1}{4}$ and turn to face in. Ending Formation: $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag (at right angles to the starting $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag). Timing: 10 beats.

Note to Callers: (Singing Call Figure) Heads Promenade half while the sides do a Right & Left Thru, Pass The Ocean, Swing Thru, Scoot And Relocate, Recycle, Square $\frac{3}{4}$, Swing Corner and Promenade... (Be sure to overlap the Sides Right & Left Thru with the Heads Promenade to time out better. Results in a $\frac{3}{4}$ Promenade.)

Comments: This figure continues to be very popular among workshop groups and weekend dancers. In spite of the Fan

The Top, the figure is quickly taught and easily handled by Mainstream dancers. By having the dancers Swing Thru in the center (as in the singing call example,) this normalizes the Fan The Top action with the girls as centers.

Current Mainstream Quarterly Selections are: Scoot Cross and Turn and Scoot and Relocate.

veloping better communication among the many facets of the square dancing activity. LEGACY is probably best known for its world-wide dancing surveys.
