The first meeting of the Delaware Valley Federation under its new officers was held on June 11, 1987. The turn out was favorable considering the beginning of the summer season and the new and unfamiliar location.

It was determined that future meetings will be rotated between the four districts. (You are aware that Bucks-Trenton is being reactivated.) Mid-East Penn has tentatively arranged for the September 10, 1987 meeting to be held at the St. Joseph University on City Line Avenue in Philadelphia. This is about one-half mile west of the Dunfey Hotel, the site of our last convention. We'd like to see more members attend the next meeting.

The 27th Convention, next year, will be chaired by our old standbys Bill & Doris Manuel. This is in addition to their efforts to bring the National Convention to the Delaware Valley in 1992. Because of the situation in Philadelphia with the new Convention Center yet to be started, Atlantic City is being considered. The Convention Committee has already made visits to both places.

Penn-Jersey was given the chairmanship of the Nominating Committee for 1988 along with the responsibility for holding the Annual Election Meeting in April.

Next year's Annual Wildwood Weekend will be held from April 29th thru May

1st. Bill Dann & Elmo Troiani will handle the calling. Based on the first two weekends, it should be a hit! Mark your calendars, and plan to attend.







## LEGACY'S BIENNIAL MEETING UPDATE

Submitted by Legacy

113 leaders from forty-two states met with four from Canada at LEGACY VIII in May. High on the agenda was a redefining/restatement of the goals and purpose of LEGACY.

The purpose of LEGACY, as stated in the bylaws, is to provide communication and to understand the operations of all the phases of square dancing in order to promote, protect and perpetuate the future of the activity through mutual understanding and cooperation throughout the world.

One happy accomplishment was reported by Ernie Stone. With its existing bylaws, including the statement above, LEGACY has been granted 503-C status as an educational organization. Future donations to and the expenses of traveling or working for LEGACY are now tax deductible.

Accomplishments by LEGACY trustees, since its inception in 1973, were noted. They were:

- Many areas now regularly hold Mini-LEGACY Leadership Seminars to enable club officers to function more efficiently and enthusiastically.

- Statements and resolutions made by LEGACY have had an influence on the total square dance activity (i.e. square dance attire).

- Five surveys have been taken, every two years, during the last ten years and the results shared with other square dance organizations.

- The promotion of Square Dance Month in September was assumed by LEGACY in the early 1980's and free promotional kits (\$1.00 postage) are supplied to those wishing them.

- Leadership Seminars at National Conventions have been coordinated and staffed by LEGACY members for five years in cooperation with the National Convention committees.

Goals for the coming biennium were suggested. These were prioritized with suggestions for implementation at the LEGACY Board Meeting which followed the National Convention in Houston. They were:

- Increase efforts in leadership training (Mini-LEGACIES) and make them more visible.

- Develop international contacts.

- Develop federation liaisons.

- Initiate process for mediation/arbitration upon specific request.

- Set guidelines for square dance activity (non-competitive status, dress, etc).

- Increase visibility of LEGACY at local square dance level.

- Expand communication with square dance leaders (through the LEGACY Log and/or new quarterly release geared to affiliate organizations and leaders).

- Increase efforts toward cooperation with other square dance organizations (CALLERLAB, ROUNDALAB, CONTRALAB, N.E.C., U.D.S.A., etc.).

- Encourage the use of free interpretive folder for new dancers now available, in order to provide better orientation.

- Set up "American Folk Dance" promotional dances in 50 states and 10 provinces.

Only two resolutions were passed; one was a minor change to the bylaws clarifying eligibility for the Board of Directors. The other came in response to flyers recently in circulation:

"We, as LEGACY trustees, resolve that extreme care should be taken in the preparation of all square dance promotional material, news items, etc.; to insure that they do not contain objectional information which would reflect unfavorably on the spirit and good taste inherent in our activity; such as reference to alcoholic beverages in connection with the square dance activity."

Newly elected Chairmen of LEGACY are Walt & Louise Cole of Ogden, Utah. Continuing as Executive Secretaries are Al & Vera Schreiner, 1100 Revere Dr., Oconomowoc, WI 53066. All information on LEGACY can be obtained from them.

Here is an ingenious way to tell the square dance story and make some money for your club, all at the same time.


How? Well, ask Dorothy Wilson's club, the Raftaires from Kansas. This club decided to sell "Potlucks and Petticoats,"



(Start From Parallel Two-Faced Lines)  
The centers facing in Extend The Tag to meet each other in the very center and Trade. The centers facing out step ahead and Fold toward the other center and the ends slide together and Trade. Now all Extend The Tag to form a column.

#### **Choreography Examples...**

(Start From Static Squares) Heads

Square Thru, Swing Thru, Boys Run, COMPRESS TO A COLUMN, All Eight Circulate, COMPRESS TO A COLUMN, Boys Run, Star Thru, Pass Thru, Wheel & Deal, Dixie Grand, Left Allemande.

(Singing Call Figure) Side Ladies Chain, Heads Pass The Ocean, Extend The Tag, Swing Thru, Boys Run, COMPRESS TO A COLUMN, Boys Run, Left Allemande, Swing, Promenade.

#### **Comments On Call...**

This call is an easy teach and feels very similar to a Triple Scoot as suggested by some dancers. Half sashayed and left handed arrangements of this call seem to offer little or no difficulty to dancers after an initial walkthru.

(Timing for Call is 6 Steps.)

Calls currently on the Plus Quarterly Selection list are: Compress To A Column; Relay, Cycle & Wheel (R.C.W.); and Spin Chain & Exchange The Gears.
