FROM THE CHAIR



Well, vacations are about half over, and I hope everyone is having a safe and happy vacation. Now it's getting close to when we have to think about our insurance again.

Notices will hopefully be sent out by the end of October. It is anticipated that there will be an increase in dues. Hopefully, it will only be a nickel.

It has been brought to my attention that some injured dancers do not know what procedure to follow:

1. Call your insurance chairman immediately to report your accident.

2. A form will be sent to you which has to be completed by you and returned to the insurance chairman.

3. File the claim with your own insurance company and the square dance insurance will pick up any remaining balance.

4. After the initial report, you will deal directly with the insurance company.

If the above procedure is followed, it should eliminate many problems. All club officers should familiarize themselves with this procedure.

Please remember that all parades, one nighters, and demos should be reported to the insurance chairman for insurance coverage of your dancers.





After interviewing with Broyhill and visiting in that area of North Carolina, we feel this is the direction for us to take.

We leave a considerable amount of unfinished business in the Federation. This is a disappointment for us, as we are sure it is for some of you. The Federation has very capable leadership, and we encourage you to support your club and district officers, and the Federation officers. Several new ideas and suggestions are presently being evaluated to relieve everyone from redundant work, and hopefully give a boost to others who will feel committed to work in the Federation. The Federation is progressing toward unification, and we would like to see this continue. Significant progress has been made in calendar scheduling to avoid conflicting dates, and some

slight interest has been generated toward a single publication for the Federation. A committee is currently working on updating the Federation By-Laws, and another committee is evaluating our annual convention (based upon comments received from a survey distributed to all the clubs in the Federation). Many articles reflect on the membership decline in the Delaware Valley, clubs folding because of financial difficulty or lack of dedicated workers at all the organization levels. On the other hand, we know of two clubs in the Federation celebrating their 40th anniversary, and one club celebrating its 35th anniversary. Accomplishments such as these display continuing loyalty and teamwork. Let's concentrate on sharing the good news and work toward making the not-so-good news as a challenge to make things better.

Special thanks to the Pen-Del District for the opportunities given to us in various ways, which led to further commitments in the Federation. It was a pleasure to serve on several convention committees and to be the General Chairmen of the 30th Convention. We thank you for your support and words of encouragement shared through the years. Friendships made in the Delaware Valley, and our experience gained by working with all of you has been most enjoyable for both of us. Best wishes to all the dancers in the Bucks Trenton, Mid-East Penn, Penn-Jersey, and Pen-Del District. The Delaware Valley is... "Simply the Best!"

CLASS NOTES



RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

As I promised, I'm back with a game that could be played along the same lines as last issue's topic — Mystery Dinner.

When handing out the menu boot to each person and asking them to select their choice, be sure to tell them to use a pencil and not to change anything once they made their selection. After they

have eaten, collect the menu boot from each person being sure they have been signed. Ask one or several people (depending on the size of your group) to help you check what choices have been made. The one with the most correct items compared to your list that you have kept a secret until now will be the winner and will receive a small prize. Then you can give the menu boots back to each person, so they can compare them with each other.

Here is another fun game to keep your party or get-together moving. Try to plan ahead. A few days before your party/picnic gather items such as burlap bags, old tableclothes, curtains, jeans, wigs, mustaches, rope ribbons, all kinds of hats, toys, dolls, balloons, cosmetics, shoes, gloves, flowers, artificial vegetables, neck ties, string, and anything else that you might think of. Put all these items in boxes and set them aside. After everyone has eaten, choose teams of three or four people and choose one of them as a model. Then give a signal for all the teams to rush to the boxes and select items that they want to dress their model in. (Try to stay with the Hillbilly/Frontier theme as much as possible.) Usher each team to an area where they won't be seen and give them each 10 to 15 minutes to dress their model. They can come back to get more items during their time limit. Then give a prize for the fun-

I'M JUST A ??

The following letter was received by Callerlab by a concerned leader:

It disturbs me to hear a square dancer say, "I'm just a Mainstream dancer," or round dancers say, "We only dance Plus II and some III," or a caller say, "I just call Mainstream." The words "just" and "only" seem to carry a connotation of apology — like, "Gee, I'm sorry, but I'm not very good because I just dance Mainstream."

There is no reason for anyone to apologize for the particular program of dancing he or she decides to participate in and enjoys, especially Mainstream squares and Phase II rounds. After all, those programs are the basis of all of our dance programs. Although there may be a few dancers who would want us to believe they came into this world as accomplished "upper level" (note the quotation marks) dancers, I have not met any in my many years of dancing, calling, and cueing. I suggest that we dance for the pleasure it gives us. That pleasure comes from many different aspects of a dance program.

For some, the sociability and friendliness is more important than the steps. For others, it is the music that gives them pleasure. For still others, it is the challenge of executing more complex steps and figures. It obviously is inappropriate to say that one group has the only answer or is better than another group. The bottom line is to enjoy the program you have chosen and learn to do it well. Studies of human nature tell us that people enjoy most that which they do well.

There is no law that says one must move "up". Unfortunately, there are those who still think in terms of levels and equate higher numbers with higher quality. That is not how it is. There are many dancers who dance Mainstream and/or Phase II and do so with good execution and styling, who can be considered better dancers than some who fake it at Advanced and/or Phases V and VI. As an old singing call suggested, "Do What You Do Well," and ENJOY!

GETTING TO ALABAMA


Listed are some suggested routes to follow when traveling to the 44th National in Birmingham, AL on June 21-24, 1995.

Use your standard five-digit zip code, add a hyphen, and then your new four-digit code. It should look something like this: 12345-6789.


