



SQUARE DANCING IS EXERCISE

If you know the benefits of exercise, and most square dancers do, then here is evidence of what joining a square can do for a dancer's fitness.

A pedometer has been carefully monitored to prove how far a dancer can square dance. This device, hooked to a belt, shows approximately how far a dancer walks, hops, or jumps — all of which are square dance activities.

Say after a square dance that the pedometer read three miles. This would include round dancing, although most round dancers are far too smooth for a pedometer to even register, except possibly during Street Fair. The reading would also exclude the two or three tips that most dancers usually sit out during the night. If a dancer squares up every tip, the mileage may vary.

Beware that the three-mile reading is only an estimate. The pedometer reading is affected by the size of a dancer's stride and may be altered if he or she actually dances forward and back (as the caller says) instead of just walking.

Square dancing distance may vary by other factors as well. For instance, if a square constantly breaks down, dancers won't rack up much mileage. Also, if the caller is nuts about promenading all the time instead of squaring through, danc-

ers may show a bit more distance. And if the caller loads the boat or dopasos all night, they can really get a dancer's pedometer whirling.

Beware too, of others who, discovering a dancer is wearing a pedometer, want to grab onto it and jiggle everything. That can throw off the whole thing.

However, despite all of the variables, a pedometer proves that square dancing is good exercise and, even in the best of squares, a dancer always has a long way to go.

skirts, western-wear coordination and
accessorizing, and many uses of the
serger — these are just a few of the
topics of the Sew and Save Program
seminars. There will be something for
everyone at Sew and Save, including an
area for the tired partners to rest while
the girls (or guys) enjoy the many events
going on at Sewing Southern Style.



LEGACY CONDUCTS PORTLAND, OR. SEMINARS

It was a full house of concerned
dancers at the daily two one-hour semi-
nars Legacy, the International Assembly
of "Trustees" of the Square Dance
Activity, presented, in conjunction with
the National Executive Committee, at the
43rd National Square Dance Convention
in Portland, OR last June. A number of
Legacy trustees served as moderators
and panelists, and handouts were avail-
able at every session.

"Attracting, Keeping, and Assimilat-
ing Dancers" attracted an overflowing
group who examined different methods
of recruiting new dancers and the value
of the various kinds of publicity avail-
able to use. Several successful drop-
out programs were discussed. All agreed
that there is also a need to educate the
new dancer about the history and mores
of the square dance activity. It was
stressed several times in attempting to
assimilate new dancers into a club that
one must be careful not to overwhelm the
new dancer.

Leaders were asked, "Who are you
training to take your place and how?"

Leaders should be planning now for their replacements. One must start planting the seeds early to give them time to sprout while showing that you actually enjoy your "job."


The topic, "Recruiting the Young — Maintaining the Young at Heart," spilled over into several seminars. Various methods and examples of getting square dancing into the school systems, the music to use, and how to show the youth we really want them were reviewed. The Diamond Square Dance Program for schools and Callerlab's Community Dance Program were also explained.

How to resolve the need for more family square dance clubs led to a lively discussion that branched out to include the problems of being a single in the square dance activity and the needs of the handicapped person. The USDA is undertaking the task of maintaining a current roster of clubs for handicapped persons.

After reviewing the Emergency Call for Medical Aid (ECMA), introduced at the

1984 National Square Dance Convention in Baltimore, MD, and going over some guidelines for emergency situations, those at the session entitled, "Dancing for the Health of It" concentrated on the health benefits of square dancing and fitness tips.

Legacy, as a communications resource center, has already begun planning for the daily NEC/Legacy seminars at the 1995 National Square Dance Convention in Birmingham, AL. 

RUTHIE'S SEWING BASKET

Hi, everyone! I trust that the following hints for Men's Square Dance Apparel will be of some help for you, especially the new dancer.

First, we will discuss the men's shirt, which should be Western style with long sleeves. It should have pearl snap buttons down the front, on the flaps of the two front pockets, and on the sleeve cuffs. Western shirts come in all colors and sizes. They can be custom made to match their partner's outfit or purchased at a square dance apparel shop. (Courtesy Tip: As a courtesy to other dancers, men should keep their sleeves down at all times with snaps closed.)

Men's slacks should also be Western style. They should be well fitted and coordinate with their shirt or their partner's outfit. Also, their belt should match their slacks.

There are three types of ties that men can wear. They are the Colonel bow tie, the boloe tie, and the square dance scarf tie secured with a tie slide. Which ever tie they decide to wear, it should match or contrast with their outfit.

Men's shoes should be made with soft leather soles and should match or coordinate with their outfit. Of course, they must also be very comfortable.

Some men wear small square dance towels which hang on a small arrangement attached to their belt. These come in very handy for the overtaking tips which come up once in a while.

All of the above items may be custom made with your own personal touch or purchased at a square dance apparel shop.

sylvania State Convention to be held on August 11-12, 1995, at the Radisson Hotel and Convention Center in Camp Hill, PA, have been selected. Registrations for this convention have already reached 907 with a cut-off at 1,100.

- **Third State Convention** — Chairmen for the Third Pennsylvania State Convention to be held in 1996 have been elected. They are Carter & Ruby Ackerman. Good luck!


- **Ways and Means** — The Ways and Means Committee is still selling front license plates for \$8.00 each. They are an excellent means of advertising.




